



## The Brilliant Club's approach to impact reports

Each year we produce more than a thousand bespoke impact reports for the school and universities we work with. We do this so that we can share the numbers and stories that tell the impact of our programmes and that matter to our partners.

Our annual impact report gives the best overview of the overall impact of our programmes. But one impact report for all activities of the charity can never answer the specific questions that are important to our partner schools and universities. *What academic progress did our pupils make while learning with a PhD researcher in university-style tutorials? What did our pupils learn at their university trips? And which competencies were our pupils able to improve between their baseline and final assignment on the programme?*

We have invested in our systems to produce automated and reliable termly impact reports for every school that we work with, each outlining pupils' progress against our university readiness competencies. The investment in systems gives us time to add individual notes to reports, for example highlighting outstanding achievements of tutors and the pupils in their tutorials.

For university partners, we report the information about the pupils that have visited the university on trips that are part of our programmes, with a specific focus on young people from groups that are typically underrepresented at university. Each report details the academic progress that pupils working with researchers from the university have made in tutorials, information that our partners can use to review their progress with access and participation targets. For researcher development partnerships with universities we also report on the professional the professional development of researchers on The Scholars Programme, using our Tutor Outcomes Framework.
