Stage 1	<p>Introductory Module</p> <p>You have likely already completed the introductory module after receiving your invitation to join The Brilliant Club. Stage 2	<p>Module 1 and 2</p> <p>Module 1 and 2 will introduce you to the key principles of planning and progress. These sessions will help you think through initial ideas for your course and how you can best support pupils through your course. At the end of these modules you will be asked to complete an exit quiz.</p>	<p>Module 1: Approximately 1.5-3 hours, including training and independent work</p> <p>Module 2: Approximately 30minutes – 1 hour</p>	Available from June 2021
Stage 3	<p>Course Design Template</p> <p>After completing your online training, you will be sent a unique link to complete and submit your course design template, which outlines your course plans in more detail. A member of The Scholars Programme team will review your course design template and send you feedback.</p>	Approximately 2-3 hours of independent work	Upon receipt of CDT link
Stage 4	<p>Creating your Handbook</p> <p>Once you receive feedback on your course design template, you are ready to start creating your final handbook. Templates and further guidance will be sent to you by The Scholars Programme team. Your handbook submission deadline will be approximately 10 days after attending our Training Day</p>	3-4 hours of independent work	You can begin this process after receiving feedback from our team
Stage 5	<p>Training Day</p> <p>Regional teams will be in touch with further information about the Training Day in your region for each term.
