- Identify improvements to ways of working with internal teams.

- Investigate issues/bugs and provide support to internal users in resolving.
- Deputise for the Lead Developer in times of absence.
- Support and champion the technology team and advocate new ways of working.
- Ensure the charity maintains the highest standards of information security protocols in product development.

Wider Support

- Supporting The Brilliant Club's wider activities as a university access charity, e.g. training events.
