



Programme Impact


For the fifth consecutive year, an evaluation by UCAS has shown that Scholars Programme graduates are more likely to **apply to, receive an offer from and progress to** a highly-selective university.

The data shows a correlation between **success on the programme and university destinations**: pupils on The Scholars Programme who submitted their final assignment and graduated from the programme were more likely to enrol at a highly-selective university (**48%**) than their peers who did not complete the programme (**28%**).

Autumn (October – February)	July
Spring (January - May)	October
Summer (March - July)	December



How to Join the Club

The school contribution is £183 per pupil, a total of £2,562 per placement, which consists of 14 pupils. This cost is subsidised through contributions from our university partners and external grants and donations.

Pupil selection

The Brilliant Club requires that at least 55% of pupils registered on the programme fulfil at least one of the following criteria:

- Eligible for free school meals
- No parental history of higher education
- Deprivation according to postcode
